





Her dedication to advocacy and powerful storytelling continues to drive positive change and inspire countless individuals to take an active role in shaping a better future.




## Director's Statement

I really pushed myself out of my comfort zone to make this film-facing fears I've carried since childhood.

I never understood how deep a bond with an animal could be until my brother and sister adopted rescue pups during COVID. Bolt and Pepper quickly became family, and it made me think of the countless street dogs I'd seen during my trips to India. I kept wondering: Who's helping them?


While researching, I found a photo of Deb Jarrett—an American woman who started a shelter for street dogs in the Himalayas. I reached out, and deep down, I knew this was the story I needed to tell, despite how uncomfortable the idea made me.






